

President's Message



Hello Everybody:

I am so happy to see clubs opening up and being able to see dear friends on the dance floor! It is truly a joy to hear “left allemande” and “weave the ring!” That gift call for well-done Plus singing calls just sounds so good. Round dancing has also returned and I am so glad for the opportunity to dance that too!!

I have great concerns regarding clubs struggling with finding halls, callers, and cuers after all this time on hiatus. Halls have been turned into homeless shelters, totally shuttered, and some still unavailable, as owners aren't sure when to open. I have been to several new locations for dances, because their former locations are not available and there isn't any definite information about when or if some halls will ever be available for dances again. It takes a lot of work to find and book halls and many clubs are still on the search for permanent homes. Callers and cuers have been cancelled and in some cases aren't available for rebooking. Snack food and drinks appears to be another major unresolved issue and will have to be worked out in the future. Some club websites have stale information and need to be updated if only to just say, “Visit us regularly and we will keep you posted on our upcoming plans”. Dance management has hit a rough spot. However, I am sure we will all pitch in and return our clubs to smooth operations.

The marketing plan has been officially launched—Yes!! The ASqD Board chose a company that has square dance experience with square dance associations, callers, and cuers. They have asked us for input for logo and slogan design and are working on it right now. That is very exciting. The next step up is to create an ASqD website and templates for clubs to use so everyone can be linked together. That way a new dancer looking for a class can easily get to the closest club locations in just a few clicks when searching. There will be a plan for

A Square D Club Happenings

Boots & Bows

After cancelling our August and September dances due to Covid concerns the Boots & Bows resumed dancing on October 16 with an Octoberfest theme at our usual venue, the Riviera United Methodist Church, in Redondo Beach. David Mee was the caller and Jim Smith the cuer. Per LA County and church venue protocol, masks were required. The Boots & Bows provided bottled water, but attendees were asked to social distance or go outside before removing masks for drinking. Attendance was disappointing but we managed to make three squares most of the evening thanks to Jim Smith's filling in. David called a great dance by giving us interesting choreography while still allowing dancers to feel comfortable as they regained their skills. We hope to continue dancing on November 20 with Steve Woodard calling.

Although the Boots & Bows are planning on presenting a SSD class, at this time a date and venue have not been determined.

Please join us at the Riviera United Methodist Church, 375 Palos Verdes Blvd, in Redondo Beach for our third-Saturday dances. The Boots & Bows will be dark in December. On January 15, 2022, the caller will be Andy Allemao and the dance theme will be A New Beginning. February 19,

2022, is the Boots & Bows 66th Anniversary Dance and Johnny Preston will be the caller. Our cuers for most months are Judy Keller and/or Jim Smith. Pre-rounds begin at 7:00 p.m. and squares are 7:30–10:00 p.m.

Buckles & Bows

We have returned to dancing, albeit under some restrictions. The Gobel Center in Thousand Oaks is requiring masks being worn for all inside the Center. Buckles & Bows is also requiring folks to be vaccinated, or show a negative COVID-19 test within the previous 48 hours.

Because of these restrictions, and the feeling that it just might be difficult to gather a decent number of “new students,” we have made the decision to postpone our new class until January. However, we are holding a Plus workshop at our regular class day/time of Tuesdays, from 7–9 p.m. While not drawing the normal 100+ plus dancers we saw pre-pandemic, we still get 7–8 squares each week, all enjoying the calls of Mike Seastrom.

We are also holding our Plus dances every fourth Saturday at Goebel. Pre-rounds start at 7 p.m, and Plus tips are from 7:30–10, with an Advanced tip at 10. Ken Bower called on October 23, with Judy Keller cueing the rounds. Mike Sikorsky called on November 27, and Cindy Mower cued rounds.

We hope you are able to join us at some of our dances. We're always dark in December.

Buttons and Bows

Over the past few months Buttons and Bows is staying connected during this time through virtual dances, encourage club members who are vaccinated and are comfortable to attend workshops. We connect through Buttons and Bows newsletter, which is sent to each member highlighting club happenings, a fun calendar, square dancing jokes, birthdays, anniversaries, and a member spotlight. On September 9th we resumed the class that had been discontinued in early 2020. Most of the students were eager to keep learning and returned to master the rest of the Plus curriculum. This class will graduate in December, and we will start our first Social Square Dancing beginners’ class in early January.

The on-going pandemic has caused financial stress for many clubs, and the Orange Coast Lariats are no exception. We have, reluctantly, increased the donation for our club dances to \$10 per dancer. Ribbons & Souls

The Ribbons & Souls are back to dancing in person! We have a new hall, and began holding Wednesday evening workshops starting in November. We plan to hold a dance in December, on the 11th. And we plan to start our new SSD class on January 5, replacing the workshops with the beginner’s class. The decisions are being rolled out as I write, and this short description leaves a lot of questions to be answered. So, please look at our website for the latest information.

Guests are welcome to our workshops. Proof of being vaccinated is required, and we need to wear a mask indoors. If you can, bring your own water, and there will be some bottles of water available. There will not be refreshments available for the time being.

We found a hall for dancing. It took a while, and success was not a given, but we found a good place to dance. Actually, we found a set of halls, all at the Veterans Memorial Building in Culver City. The Multipurpose Room is best suited to our workshops, dances and beginners’ classes. The Iksan Room is good for the Tuesday A1/A2 class and our Sunday round dance class.

The Veterans Memorial Building is located at the intersection of Overland and Culver Blvd., on the south west corner, with parking in a lot that stretches along Culver Blvd. with multiple entrances. From the 405 Freeway, take the Culver Blvd. exit, travel east several blocks, and when you see a long parking lot go in and find a place to park. If you are coming from the 10 Freeway, take the Overland exit, travel many blocks south, cross Venice Blvd., go three more blocks, turn right on Culver Blvd. and make an immediate left into the parking lot. Park. Walk to the front of the building and go inside. As you stand inside the entrance, the long hall to the left is where the Iksan Room can be found. To find the Multipurpose Room, take this same hall to the end, exit the building, turn right, find the ramp that leads to a large patio, and the hall is right there with a wall of windows facing the patio.

We ended up having a line dance and Plus workshop for the remainder of the time. We have high hopes that our next Beginner classes that start on January 13th, 2022 will yield better results.

Our last dance in 2021 is on December 11th at the Anaheim United Methodist Church, 1000 South State College Blvd., Anaheim. The Pre-rounds begin at 7:30 pm, and Square Dancing goes from 8:00 pm to 10:30 pm. There is a Singles' Rotation. There will be an Advanced Tip after the 3rd Plus tip.
